Kia Ora Welcome to the Mighty Waikato

A warm welcome awaits visitors in the Waikato – a place of natural beauty, powerful history, and out-of-this-world experiences.


The Waikato is situated in the central North Island, and its commercial and cultural hub, Hamilton, is the fourth largest in New Zealand.

Go underground to experience the wonders of the caves where a myriad of glowworms sparkle, stories of exploration are told and there is black water rafting, abseiling and ziplining to thrill. Movie buffs will delight in the 'real Middle-earth' at Hobbiton[™] Movie Set, near Matamata, as seen in The Lord of the Rings and The Hobbit trilogies.

Many say the life force of the region is the mighty Waikato River, the longest in the country, and the perfect playground. On the water there is jetboating, kayaking, rowing The rich natural environment of the Waikato is a dream come true for visitors who like to get out into the great outdoors, whether it is to take a gentle stroll, or go hiking or biking. The region is ribboned with trails including Te Awa River Ride and two Great **Rides of New Zealand** -the Timber Trail and Hauraki Rail Trail.

and fishing, while along the river banks there are picturesque cycling and walking trails and picnic spots too.

A gourmet paradise, the Waikato has a wide array of foodie



experiences including award-winning eateries, microbreweries, artisan producers, markets, and berry farms where you can pick your own delicious treats.

Nourish the soul with a soak at Te Aroha Mineral Spas, or meander through the award-winning Hamilton Gardens where historically important garden styles from the farthest reaches of the world have been recreated.

The Waikato is host to outstanding events like the Hamilton Arts Festival Toi Ora ki Kirikiriroa, the New Zealand National Agricultural Fieldays and the spectacular Balloons over Waikato. For arts and culture there are a number of galleries and studios throughout the region, as well as performance art venues, museums and heritage centres.

The home of Kīngitanga, the Māori King Movement, the Waikato has been a significant area for Māori since the great voyaging Tainui waka (canoe) made landfall in Kāwhia more than 800 years ago. Sites in Hamilton/Kirikiriroa and throughout the Waikato tell the stories of the region.

The Waikato has become a major hub for high-performance sport with world-class cycling and rowing facilities and Olympic champions based in the region. Always far from the ordinary, the Waikato is a welcoming region where the people keep it real – and experiences become unreal.



Outdoor Adventures

The Waikato has plenty to appeal to people who like to get out into the great outdoors, above and below ground, with some of New Zealand's most well-loved trails and tracks threading through the region.

New Zealand's longest river, the mighty Waikato, provides excellent kayaking, boating and other water sports opportunities, while the quintessential seaside town of Raglan is a mecca for surfers, or those wanting to simply relax. The extensive Raglan Harbour is sought after for kayaking, paddle-boarding and sunset cruises.

The region is also home to two of the nation's Great Rides, each offering different adventures. Walking trails range from family-friendly experiences to more challenging winding mountain tracks with the view at the summit the perfect reward.

Hamilton City

Hamilton is the Waikato's metropolitan hub on the banks of the mighty Waikato River. With a vibrant arts scene, great shopping, award-winning restaurants and a bustling nightlife, Hamilton City is the perfect hub for exploring the Waikato.

Check out the animals at Hamilton Zoo, visit Hamilton Gardens, indulge in gourmet experiences, or take a hot air balloon ride to admire the view from above.

With some of the best venues in the country, Hamilton is renowned for hosting world-class events, from international sporting fixtures to arts festivals and concerts.



Middle-earth Movie Magic

If the Shire is at the heart of Middle-earth, then the Waikato region is at the heart of the Shire. When renowned Kiwi film director, Sir Peter Jackson, went looking for the perfect setting for the Shire, the home of the hobbits, for his The Lord of the Rings and The Hobbit trilogies he found it right here in the Waikato.

Subsequently the set was adapted to become the permanent attraction of Hobbiton[™] Movie Set. Visitors to the set can just imagine the hobbits going about their everyday business with tours including iconic sites such as the Green Dragon[™] Inn and The Millhouse[™].

Tolkien-esque landscapes can also be found in other parts of the Waikato, such as the Waitomo area, where towering limestone bluffs give way to mysterious caverns.

Underground Wonders

Millions of years in the making, the Waitomo Caves are a must-do New Zealand attraction and have been enthralling visitors since the late 1800s.

This subterranean world of stalagmites, stalactites and underground waterfalls is full of geological and historical wonder. From families to thrill-seekers, visitors will love the options for exploring the caves. On one hand, there are guided tours of the caverns with their awe-inspiring limestone formations and gentle boat rides under galaxies of twinkling glowworms; on the other there are the blood-pumping adventures like black water rafting on underground streams, abseiling and ziplining in the depths.

Top 10 Family Fun Activities

1 Experience the magic of glowworms in the Waitomo Caves. Enjoy the world-famous boat ride, gliding on a subterranean stream under thousands of twinkling glowworms.

2 Visit Ōtorohanga Kiwi House and Sanctuary Mountain Maungatautari to get up close to native birds or explore Hamilton Zoo, home to over 600 native and exotic animals.

3 Explore Hamilton Gardens: Download a free kids activity sheet, visit the traditional Māori or Surrealist garden, to name a few.

Get out on the water paddling a kayak or a stand-up paddle-board.

5 Visit Waikato Museum: Experience the fun interactive kids exhibitions. 6 Explore hundreds of kilometres of local cycling and walking tracks.

7 Relax at Kāwhia Ocean Beach where you can dig your own natural hot water spa at low tide.

Take the family along to experience Middleearth at the spectacular Hobbiton™ Movie Set.

Check out some of Hamilton City's indoor family-friendly activities including escape rooms, mini golf, trampoline parks and Bowl and Social at SkyCity Hamilton.

10 Visit the destination playgrounds dotted around the region such as the playground at Hamilton Gardens, Hare Puke Park, or Jim Barker Memorial Playground in Ōtorohanga.

Where to Stay in the Waikato

Visitors to the region can choose from a variety of accommodation options - from high-end city hotels to ecostyle glamping or family breaks in beachside holiday parks. Enjoy a touch of luxury in a boutique lodge, or if a self-contained option is preferred, the region's motels and serviced apartments are a great choice.

Getting Around

The region's central location means it's simple and easy to get around, with most attractions within one and a half hours' drive of Hamilton City and expressway links with Auckland. Domestic flights operate from Hamilton Airport, the passenger rail service, Te Huia, connects Waikato to Auckland, and the Northern Explorer rail service includes the Waikato on its Auckland to Wellington journey.

Thermal Explorer Highway Touring Route

The Waikato region features on the Thermal Explorer Highway. This touring route exits Auckland and takes in some of the top spots in the central North Island, from Hamilton and the wider Waikato region, through to Rotorua, Taupō and Ruapehu. Working in conjunction with the Pacific Coast Highway, these touring routes provide the perfect way to explore the central North Island.

Cycle Trails

Home to two of New Zealand's Great Rides, the Waikato gives riders an up-close look at the picturesque scenery and fascinating history. From riverside trails to ancient forests, or purpose-built mountain bike parks, there is something to suit all levels of cyclists.

Trail Grades:













Hauraki Rail Trail, Te Aroha:

One of the easier rides in the region's cycle trail network, showcasing the rich pioneering history of the area.

- Matamata to Te Aroha 37km
- Te Aroha to Paeroa 23km
- Paeroa to Waihi 24km
- Paeroa to Thames 34km
- Thames to Kaiaua 55km

The Timber Trail, Waitomo District:

A spectacular, two-day backcountry ride through the Pureora Forest Park, steeped in Māori narratives and logging history.

- Pureora Village to Pureora Mountain 8km
- Pureora to Ongarue, full trail 85km

Te Awa - The Great New Zealand River Ride, Ngāruawāhia to Lake Karapiro:

65km of easy cycling and walking tracks along the banks of New Zealand's longest river.

- Ngāruawāhia to Hamilton 26km
- Hamilton Gardens to Cambridge 31km
- Cambridge to Lake Karapiro 8km

Hamilton City River Rides:

This shared walkway and cycleway runs through central Hamilton along the mighty Waikato River and under the many iconic bridges that Hamilton is known for.

Cycle Trails



Mt Pirongia Mountain Bike Trails: Around 12km of off-road trails wind through the forest at Sainsbury Road Reserve west of Pirongia. A kids track and pump track provide great off road children's cycling, with other options to suit intermediate to advanced riders.











Mt Te Aroha Mountain Bike Trails:

Nestled in the foothills of Mount Te Aroha, the 10km track starts and ends in Te Aroha Hot Springs Domain by the Mokena Geyser offering something for all abilities, including challenging ascents and exhilarating downhill sections for more daring riders.

Raglan Cycle Trails, Raglan:

Ride the Mount Karioi Loop trail or get close to the giant wind turbines at Te Uku Windfarm.

- Mount Karioi Loop: 45km loop
- Pipiwharauroa Trail/Te Uku Windfarm: 18km return
- Te Ara Kakariki: 6km total distance

Velodrome, Cambridge:

Features a world-class 250m velodrome track, which is open to the community for a range of programmes and track cycling lessons. Links to the Gallagher Bike Skills Park, Te Awa River Ride and nearby BMX, road and trail facilities.

Te Miro Mountain Bike Park, Cambridge:

Situated 20 minutes northeast of Cambridge and popular with a wide cross section of riders. Access via Waterworks Road, Te Miro. Grade depends on the track cycled.

- Track lengths vary from 500m to 3km
- Total track network of over 20km

Hamilton Mountain Bike Track:

Located within Hamilton's northern city limits and suitable for beginners and families as well as more advanced riders. Access via Maui Street, Hamilton.

- Compact single track
- 10km in length

Walking and Hiking Trails

The region's natural environment provides great scenery for walking and hiking trails of all levels and lengths. Ancient volcanic bush-clad mountains and wildlife reserves give way to the stunning Waikato River and fertile rolling hills. Te Araroa, 'The Long Pathway', also passes through the region.









Hākarimata Scenic Reserve, Ngāruawāhia:

Featuring ancient native Kauri trees, spectacular views and the infamous stair climb.

- Kauri Loop track 2hrs return
- Summit track 3hrs return
- Waterworks track 1hr return



Mt Pirongia, Pirongia: Take a stroll along the Mangakara Nature Walk or opt for an overnight excursion

Walk, or opt for an overnight excursion on the Tirohanga – Mahaukura round trip. Access via Grey Road.

- Mangakara Nature Walk 1hr return
- Bell Track 6-10hrs one way
- Mahaukura Lookout 2-3hrs one way



Wairere Falls, Matamata:

Follow well-formed tracks and climb stairs to the base of the impressive 153m falls, the highest in the North Island, or continue on to reach the lookout at the top. Access via Goodwin Road off Te Aroha-Okauia Road. • Wairere Falls track 3-4hrs return



Hamilton Gardens, Hamilton:

Over 20 themed gardens including Te Parapara Māori Garden, Egyptian Garden and much more.

- Themed gardens open 9am to 5pm daily
- Wider parkland areas always open



Mt Te Aroha, Te Aroha:

Climb to the summit for spectacular views. Visit Waiorongomai Valley for great walks with gold mining history.

- Te Aroha Mountain track 3hrs
- Domain Loop track 20min
- Waiorongomai Valley low-level loop 2hrs return



Maungakawa Scenic Reserve, Cambridge:

This scenic reserve boasts regenerating native forest with a scattering of exotic trees. Spot some native birdlife on an easy 30 minute loop walk. Access via Gudex Road, off Maungakawa Road.









Wairēinga/Bridal Veil Falls, Raglan:

An easy 10-minute walk to the top of the 55m Bridal Veil Falls, followed by a set of steps to the bottom viewing platform. Access via Kawhia Road off State Highway 23.

- 20min return to top of the falls
- 40min return to the bottom

Waikato River Walks, Hamilton:

Stroll along the banks of the Waikato River in Hamilton for a tranquil escape from city life. Popular with runners for an early morning workout, the tracks are also suitable for cyclists.

• Various lengths and access points

Ötorohanga Kiwiana Walk, Ötorohanga: Celebrating all things New Zealand, the Ōtorohanga Kiwiana Walk is great for families. Access via main street, Ōtorohanga.

• Featuring kiwiana from No.8 Wire to the pavlova and more

Ruakuri Walk, Waitomo:

This loop walk includes limestone outcrops, native forest and small caves. The highlight is the viewing platform into the Ruakuri Natural Tunnel, a highceiling cave where you can view large stalactites and stalagmites.

• 45min return

Taitua Arboretum, Hamilton:

Featuring lakes, woodland gardens, birdlife all linked by a network of walking tracks, the arboretum is perfect for a leisurely weekend stroll, family picnic or a more active outing.

- Tackle the Hākarimata Summit track in Ngāruawāhia: Over a thousand steps lead to spectacular panoramic views over the stunning landscape
- Learn about New Zealand's historic land wars: Visit the site of Rangiriri and learn about the cultural significance of the area



- Feed the need for speed: From V8 supercars and go-karting at Hampton Downs, to watching the drag races at Meremere and the stockcars at the speedway in Huntly
- Order an ice cream as big as your face in Pokeno: Renowned for its enormous ice creams and delicious local bacon

Steeped in cultural history, the North Waikato area and town of Ngāruawāhia is home to the Māori King and the Kīngitanga movement, with significant historical New Zealand Wars sites throughout the area.

Learn about the area's history and visit the sites of the influential land wars by exploring the towns between Tūākau to Ngāruawāhia, all with cultural and historical significance.

In the North Waikato, small towns and villages dot the landscape with an eclectic lineup of shops and cafés while bush-clad mountains make way for rugged coastlines and the mighty Waikato River meets the Tasman Sea at Port Waikato. This somewhat untouched slice of Kiwi paradise is



popular with surfers, keen fishermen and holiday makers alike; offering a secluded escape, fresh seafood and a number of great fishing spots.

Those looking for gourmet delights will not be disappointed, with artisan producers of cheese, bacon and whiskey all calling the North Waikato area home, not to mention the local markets and huge ice creams found at Pokeno.

While those looking for some adrenaline and the roar of engines can find it at the key motorsport facilities located in the area - ranging from speedways and drag racing tracks to the world-class Hampton Downs Motorsport Park, with its on-track

experiences and events.

The North Waikato area also boasts many popular walking trails, from easy lakeside tracks to challenging full day hikes.

The picturesque Lake Hakanoa in Huntly is a popular and easy family friendly walking trail, while the Hākarikata Ranges provide many options such as the Kauri Loop track and the Hākarimata Summit track with its popular stair climb.

Te Awa, the Great NZ River Ride cycleway stretches along the Waikato River, from Ngāruawāhia in the north to Lake Karapiro in the south. Be sure to ride across the Perry Bridge, an iconic 130m bridge, at Horotiu.

Waitomo also stakes a claim in Middle-earth with the towering limestone cliffs, primeval native forest and massive rock formations of Mangaotaki Valley, near Piopio, the location for Trollshaws Forest in The Hobbit: An Unexpected Journey. The stunning black sands of the west coast of the Waikato region can be found at Mokau, Awakino, Marokopa and Kāwhia visitors can dig their own, natural hot water spa at low tide.

Nearby Ōtorohanga, the self-proclaimed Kiwiana capital, celebrates all things New Zealand plus the chance to see the native kiwi up close.

Further south, the "Sheep Shearing Capital" of the country, Te Kuiti, has an impressive statue of a shearer paying homage to the long standing tradition of the New Zealand Shearing and Wool Handling Championships and the Great New Zealand Muster.


